## Valley to Change Reunion Format

As Supreme Council has changed the requirements of an “official” Reunion, the Board of Trustees of the Valley of Cleveland has decided to change our Reunion format accordingly in the hopes of making them more interesting, convenient and enjoyable.

Many of our members remember Reunions lasting three, four or even five and six days. By the mid-1980's, the Supreme Council had authorized “One Day” Reunions that at that time had to include the 14<sup>th</sup> Degree, the 15<sup>th</sup> or 16<sup>th</sup> Degree, the 18<sup>th</sup> Degree and the 32<sup>nd</sup> Degree (which today is the 31<sup>st</sup> and 32<sup>nd</sup> Degrees). Consequently, the Valley of Cleveland would have a two day Reunion in the Fall and a One Day Reunion in the Spring. Since 2000, most of our Reunions have been one day affairs. When Ohio started to have Grand Master's One Day Classes in 2002, Supreme Council began to permit the Valleys (who were hosting these events) to follow with a One Degree Reunion (initially the 32<sup>nd</sup> Degree), and this, of course, led to the rewriting of the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree that now makes Masons “Scottish Rite Masons” (but not 32<sup>nd</sup> Degree Masons), and is the Degree now portrayed after a Grand Master's Class. The official Reunion then had the new 4<sup>th</sup> Degree added to the other four “required” Degrees.

In 2011, Supreme Council has again redefined what constitutes a “Reunion”, and now, an official one must consist of: the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree, three “other” Degrees, and the 31<sup>st</sup> and 32<sup>nd</sup> Degrees (which will soon be reunited again as the 32 Degree). As a result, the Valley of Cleveland has decided to embrace this format, and change our Reunions for the foreseeable future. Starting at the Spring Reunion on Saturday, April 28, 2012, we will exemplify the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree, three “other” Degrees (that will be announced in the next edition of the “Scottish Rite News”), and the 31<sup>st</sup> and 32<sup>nd</sup> Degrees. We hope that this change will have several very positive results:

- 1) Reducing the time the Reunion takes to complete. Currently, we start at 8:30 a.m. (registration at 7:30 a.m., and make-up call for the casts as early as 7:00 a.m.) and finish between 5:30 and 6:00 p.m. By replacing 14, 15 and 18 with other Degrees, we should be able to save at least two hours during the course of the day and we will be able to utilize the DeMolay Room for more Degrees during the day;
- 2) Since we started exemplifying Degrees after our Four Coordinate Bodies Meetings, attendance at those meetings has improved dramatically. We are hoping that this change will stimulate attendance at our Reunions, as we exemplify Degrees which are seen less frequently;
- 3) We will continue to exemplify Degrees following Four Coordinate Bodies Meetings, but now we will head to the auditorium for the 14°, 15° and 18°.

We believe these changes will have their desired effect, and make our Reunions more desirable for our membership, increasing attendance and thereby spreading the light of Scottish Rite Freemasonry.

## Annual Meeting Scheduled for March 5, 2012

The Board of Trustees proposed a change to our By-Laws at our October 2011 Four Coordinate Bodies Meeting. The proposed change was printed in the October, November, December 2011 edition of “The Scottish Rite News”, and the membership voted its acceptance at our December 5, 2011 Meeting. As a result, this is the official notification that our 2012 Annual Meeting and Election of Officers will be held in the DeMolay Room on Monday, March 5, 2012, at 7:00 p.m.

The meeting will include all annual reports, and as three of our four bodies have Presiding Officers who have completed two years in office, three new officers will be elected to preside and make their appointments that night. The Annual Installation of Officers will be held in the DeMolay Room on Monday, May 7, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. The Installation will be open to all ladies and guests, and as there is no Stated Meeting that night, they will be invited in to join with us promptly at seven.

We hope that all our members will make plans to attend the Annual Meeting and cast their votes to determine the leadership of the Valley for the ensuing year.
